We had a good walk, getting 24 species when the prediction was 24.7. We got 4 species that had zero probability, but we also missed a number that we expected to get, such as Bushtit and Northern Mockingbird. But, I'm not complaining. It was a nice day, nice and dry, as opposed to last week's rainy weather. The highlight bird by far was the Black-throated Gray Warbler. We haven't seen one in this warbler season so it was nice to see this beauty. Next most interesting were the pair of White-breasted Nuthatches that appear to be nesting in the hole the starlings have used in the past. This hole is in a tree just as you exit Tournament Park. We'll hopefully get quite a few sightings of this nice bird going forward.
