Walk lasted between 12:00 and 14:00

We had a very good walk, getting 26 species when the prediction was 22.7. The highlight birds had to be the 6 American White Pelicans, followed closely by the Red-naped Sapsucker and the Western Flycatcher. The sapsucker was in Tournament Park but not on the Sapsucker Tree. The pelicans flew over us on Holliston. With the 26 sightings we could easily have tied the record of 28 for the week if a few regulars had showed up. Missing in action were Band-tailed Pigeon (88%), the California Towhee (88%) and the Bewick's Wren (62%). Oh well, we did get three zero-probability birds, so that was good.
