The rain stopped long enough for us to get a walk in and it was a good walk. We observed 24 species, 1.5 short of the prediction, which is close enough for government work. Our zero-probability bird was a European Starling, looking to be clearing out a nest hole at the exit to Tournament Park. And just before that we saw a Downy Woodpecker, one Chris had seen on her way to the walk. There was also a Nuttall's Woodpecker nearby and an Acorn Woodpecker too. So, we had three species of woodpecker in view at essentially the same time. We longed for a Northern Flicker but couldn't find the one someone thought they heard. It was a good woodpecker day, though. We were also pleased to see a Turkey Vulture and an American Robin. Very good walk indeed.
