We ended up with a better than predicted number of species observed. We got 26, whereas the prediction was 24.5. How we got the the maximum for the week of 35 is a good question. Quite a feat. The stellar bird came at the end of the walk when Viveca spotted a

Black-throated Gray Warbler. Beautiful bird. I think it was unusual to get 13 probability 1 birds.
The only zero probability bird was the Cedar Waxwing.
Viveca also spotted those first as a flock passed overhead. It was a good walk.
