Viveca did the spectacular walk alone and added these general comments:

With respect to some birds she said:

Nashville Warbler: "we also saw this last week but I was too chicken to put it on the list, had a very good look today!"

With respect to Rufous Hummingbird: "1 male rufous hummingbird, one female (both very aggressive and male had NO green on body with ORANGE bib with female somehow different than other hummer, Allen's or Anna's, females. They are found on the succulents in the round planter in the north community garden."

Now let me add a comment: This was a sensational walk any way you look at it. First, it set the record for week 15 by 3 species! Previous record was 29. Second, the last time we had as many as 32 species on a walk was 1/27/2016, more than 4 years ago. And to find one higher than 32, you have to go back to 3/28/2011, when we recorded 37 species, the all-time high. So, great job, Viveca!
