We had a good walk, observing 24 species, which was 1.8 above the predicted number. The highlight was the Wilson's Warbler, spotted in Tournament Park. It has been a while since we saw any of the more unusual warblers, so that was good. We also saw a couple of Orange-crowned Warblers and one was singing its song loud and clear. Other good birds were 2 Cedar Waxwings and an Oak Titmouse. The European Starling was seen going into its nest hole just at the exit to Tournament Park. Nothing to complain about with this walk.
