Walk lasted between 12:00 and 13:48.

So, after taking a week off, the birds were back. We observed 19 species, 2.6 above the prediction and only 4 short of the record for the week. We appeared to have missed a Cooper's Hawk nesting situation on Arden Rd, as we saw two juveniles and an adult playing around down there. But we never saw them in a nest. What was astounding, and not in a good way, was the lack of an Anna's Hummingbird. It was 100% probable for this week, but next year it will only be 88% probable. The rarity was a White-throated Swift at 12% probable, but we've been seeing them lately and I've seen a bunch in other parts of Pasadena, so I would have been surprised if we didn't see one. And one it was. Overall, a good walk.
