One new one was Kevin Kan, father of Calvin and husband of Wan-Ying. So, the Kan family was well represented. I would say the most interesting part of the walk occurred in the little park

just south of the IPAC building. We had two Nuttall's Woodpeckers in the same tree with a Bewick's

Wren that got attacked by a Dark-eyed Junco. Also interesting towards the end of the walk was what looked like a hybrid hawk – Red-tailed X Red-shouldered. The chest looked like a red-tailed

but the tail had faint bands on it. We finally went with juvenile Red-shouldered. Good walk!
