We had quite the group of walkers today, 14 to be exact. That probably is a record but finding that out proved harder than I thought. Three were new or the Caltech birdwalks, two undergrads, Renee and Audrey, and Chris's cousin Maureen. And the group produced a record-tying walk! We observed 20 species, which tied the record for the week. The prediction was 17.2, so not a lot of difference between the max and the prediction this week. I don't usually single out someone for their efforts but I feel I must mention Wan-Ying. She was not only the first to spot the Bushtits but she was the one who spotted the 20th bird. She and the rest of the Kan family were trailing behind when she saw a bird that she couldn't identify, but she knew it was different from what we'd seen. She rushed forward and got us back to where we could all see it: a Cassin's Kingbird. Good for Wan-Ying. We would have missed that one had she not seen it. Other good birds were an Oak Titmouse and 2 Mitred Parakeets. Both of those were zero probability birds.

What was a downer was not seeing a Northern Mockingbird. It was 100% probable but didn't show up. That one would have had us seeing a new record for the week. Nevertheless, it was a great walk.
