## Walk lasted between 12:00 and 14:05

We did very well this week, observing 23 species when 19.5 was the prediction. We thought we could get close to the record for the week, which was 27, if we had seen some very-likely-to-see birds. For example, we didn't see a Mourning Dove at 100% probability, nor a Lesser Goldfinch at 75% probability. And we missed the House Sparrows that have been very reliable lately. And we missed seeing a Townsend's Warbler at 62% probable (same as for House Sparrow). So there are 4 birds that would have tied the record and should have been seen. On the other hand, we did see 4 birds that had zero probability, so we shouldn't complain.

Wan-Ying was at it again with an addition to the 39<sup>th</sup> anniversary book she gave me last week. There are 3 new pages and the photos of them are below. The pictures of the 15 rare birds was

in the original edition but in this addendum, she's identified them. And she's added a list of the walkers in the 100-walk club. Six of those listed were on the walk today. Thank you, Wan-Ying!
