Wow, great walk! We got a new bird for the Caltech list! It was a Costa's Hummingbird. It was spectacular. Meagan and I high-fived when we saw it, but I didn't know then that it was new for the Caltech bird list. I thought we might have seen one before, but a search of the records revealed otherwise. So, we are up to 127 unique species sighted on the walks. We have been getting a new one approximately once per year over the last few years. We got a new one in 2016 and 2017, but missed 2018. We are now back on track. FYI: the Costa's was over in the garden area on Wilson, just north of the parking structure.

We had some other good birds: 2 Cassin's Kingbirds in the Athletic field south of Brown Gym, a Townsend's Warbler down on Arden Rd., and the first Ruby-crowned Kinglets of the Fall season.

The weather was perfect, 66 F. Y'all should have been there!
