We observed 20 species, 0.3 above the prediction, but well short of the maximum for the week of 24. We again saw the Western Tanager, the Red-naped Sapsucker, and the Nuttall's Woodpecker in the Woodpecker Tree over on Arden. We discovered a second woodpecker tree on Arden, across the street and a bit to the south from the first one. It has a lot of rows of sapsucker holes but no woodpeckers seen this time. Another good sighting was the Western Bluebirds out on the South Athletic field. They were only 12% probable but we started talking about them and they suddenly appeared. It was a good walk.
