The Watershore_bird, sp,. was from Calvin and Wan-Ying who saw 3 long-necked dark birds fly overhead. Probably cormorants but I decided to be less specific. We missed a couple of 88 percenters, Band-tailed Pigeon and Bushtit. We need to start thinking about when to have the last walk of the year. Christmas eve is on a Wednesday and that won't work for me. I propose Friday 26 December. We can discuss it on the next walk.
