This was a hot walk, both weatherwise and birdwise. We observed 29 species, 4.4 above the predicted number. The Kan family and I observed something I don't recall seeing before: two juncos attacking a squirrel. There is something to be said for going up Wilson towards Del Mar, which is was our turn to do. Pretty good highlights elsewhere as well, as we saw 5 Chipping Sparrows, a Red-naped Sapsucker, two Oak Titmice, and a White-breasted Nuthatch. Not half-

bad. Disappointments were the California Towhee and the Black Phoebe. Both of those were 88% probable but nowhere to be found. All in all, a great walk.
