We observed 25 species, including two warbler species and the Hooded Oriole. The 25 was 2.2 above the prediction, so a very good walk. We also got the White-breasted Nuthatches, but not in their normal spot. They are branching out. We also observed 3 hawk species, which was good, but all three were on the checklist, so not totally unexpected. We had 12 probability 1 species, which I don't think is a record (13?), but we added 3 zero probables, and I am wondering whether the combined 15 for zeroes + ones is a record. Wan-Ying?
