We observed 22 species, well above the prediction of 19.3. Two more and we would have tied the record for the week. The most interesting sighting was the Red-tailed Hawk on Holliston perched in a tree and eating a bird. We could not identify the bird. I was surprised that a large hawk could catch a bird about the size of a scrub-jay. But it did. Viveca saw a Yellow Warbler, quite unusual for this time of year and we again found the hooded orioles in the park south of the IPAC building. We also found the Oak Titmouse there. Nice walk.
