We had another record-setting walk, observing 23 species, when the previous record was 21. The prediction was only 15.8, so we had a great walk. The highlight bird was one I didn't see, but others did, the Western Tanager, a male no less. We did have a good day on zero probability birds: California Scrub-Jay, White-breasted Nuthatch, Turkey Vulture, Kingbird, species, and the Western Tanager. That was 5, but pretty sure that's not a record. The birds seem to be more oblivious to the heat than in previous years, as we've set quite a few records this summer.
